As far as the leadership boot camp is concerned, we went hoping to find out more about our chapter becoming a 501.c.3 instead of the 501.c.7 as we currently are. The difference is that we can give tax-deductible receipts as the former. It's a little more onerous to maintain legally, but the longer-term benefits to the chapter could be positive. We didn't find out anything really useful in that regards. We did try to dig but were consistently referred to Patty, EAA's chapter volunteer attorney.

We did learn some neat things. It was exciting to learn that EAA national is offering a new \$10,000 scholarship annually from a \$1,000,000 annual budget from a sponsor called, "The Ray Foundation". The chapter leadership must submit an application to EAA National. Upon meeting the criteria (not yet revealed to us in whole) and being approved, then and only then could we possibly move forward to award the scholarship to kids of specific age ranges. 16-18. Those ages were also not set in stone. There was some talk of extending to 19. We don't really know any more particulars at this time as they are still being ironed out by EAA national. We will learn more later this month at a scheduled webinar. We have a few good candidates for this year in mind already! Among the attached photos, only one of the engines depicted are for the Sonex. Guess which one?


